




### May 15, 2003 - PALESTINE: A DAY OF REMEMBRANCE

Nigherian democracy activist Hafsat Abioloa, daughter of opposition leader Mushad Abioloa who was murdered by Nigerian authoritarians, as was her mother. World renowned anti-nuclear war activist Dr. Helen Caldicott reminds audience of 200 women that accidental nuclear war could be upon us within minutes and calls for women to do a nude protest at the White House during the next days march. (Speech at Indymedia.) A couple dozen women seemed ready to join. While march leaders evidently squashed the idea, a number of women went topless in protest anyway.

Huge Valentines heart.




Couple hundred protesters block 42nd Street, behind Library, as police assemble a block away. I was on the way to Greyhound Station and don't know what happened next.

More than a dozen libertarians protested, joing 100,000 odd other peaceniks. Protesters marched from the Mall to the Navy Yard.


